# **Message from Pastor**

# **Advent**

Every December the world rushes headlong into the holidays, but Lutherans do something strange by the world's standards: we decline to sing Christmas carols... yet. Instead, we light a blue candle (or sometimes purple) and start singing the ancient, minor-key plea: "O come, O come, Immanuel, and ransom captive Israel." We call these four weeks Advent, from the Latin *adventus— "coming." It is not a warm-up for Christmas; it is its own season with its own voice. And that voice is urgent.* 

Advent is the season when the Church remembers two things at once: Christ has come, and Christ is coming again. We live between the times.

# The First Coming

The first candle reminds us that the Lord once came in humility. He came to a people who had waited centuries for the Messiah, yet when He arrived He was not recognized by most. A teenage girl in Nazareth, a feed-trough in Bethlehem, a sojourn to Egypt- this is how the King entered His world. The Lutheran Confessions speak of the humilitas Christi, the lowliness of Christ. In Advent we do not rush past the manger to the angels and shepherds; we linger in the night, because the world is still dark and the Church is still waiting.

# **The Coming Again**

Yet Advent is never only backward-looking. We frequently confess, "From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead." The second, third, and fourth candles point us forward to the day when the same Jesus, now hidden in lowliness, will be revealed in glory. The Reformation kept the church's ancient hope of the visible return of Christ burning brightly. We do not spiritualize the Second Coming into a vague feeling of "Jesus in my heart." We expect a day, a trumpet, a sky cracked open, a Judge on the throne, and a renewed creation where "the wolf shall lie down with the lamb" (Isaiah 11).

# **The Present Coming**

Between these two advents—Bethlehem and the Last Day—there is a third coming Lutherans cherish: Christ comes to us now, hidden, yet revealed in humble means. He comes in water that drowns the Old Adam and raises a saint. He comes in words preached by a sinner. He comes in bread and wine that are his body and blood. The same Lord who once lay in a manger now gives us the forgiveness of sins. Advent, therefore, is not only waiting for a future event; it is learning to recognize Jesus is already present where He has promised to be.

Then why the somber blue and the minor hymn keys? Because the world is still under the curse. Because 2,000 years after the first Christmas, there are still wars and rumors of wars, marriages still fracture, cancer wards are still full, and we ourselves still sin every day. Advent refuses to let us fabricate false refuge with plastic smiles and premature "Jingle Bells." It forces us to say, "Yes, Christ has come- and still 'O Lord, how long?"

Yet Advent is not despair. The very name *Immanuel means* "God with us"—not "God who will someday be with us," but God who is with us even in the dark. The Lutheran chorales of the season are full of this defiant joy: "Rejoice, rejoice! *Immanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.*" We know the end of the story.

### How then shall we keep Advent?

- Come to the midweek services. The hymns, the prayers, the preaching are crafted to form you for watchful, hopeful waiting.
- Use an Advent wreath at home. Light one more candle each week and read the appointed Scriptures. Let your household see that Christmas joy is something we are prepared to receive, not something we manufacture.
- Expect Christ where He promises to be found: in the Word read, the absolution spoken, the Sacrament received.

Soon enough the paraments will turn white, the Gloria will thunder out, and we will sing "Joy to the World" with abandon. But not yet. For now we watch. For now we pray, "Stir up Your power, O Lord, and come."

The Lord is coming—He who once came as a baby, who now comes in Word and Sacrament, and who will come again as King. Even so, come, Lord Jesus.


